We must constantly remind individuals that we need to be notified of changes of address or facilities. If we get returned mail (about 20 each month), we remove that individual from the files. If you have, or you are going to be moved, please drop us a note to keep your file active. We get mail returned for bad ID #'s, no cell #, and no bed #. Make sure that your return address is inside the envelope as well as on the envelope – we get many damaged envelopes that are unreadable.

- (7) Would the logo/drawing be better used for a different purpose?








One of the favorites of the staff. We were informed by Steve, the individual setting up the graphics for the shirts, that the smokestack would be hard to reproduce with print or embroidery. Would require digital prints. This locomotive presents M.O.M. as an unstoppable force that will continue on. Surprisingly enough, there are individuals that have never heard of M.O.M., so we need to print the “*Moving On Ministry*” with the drawing. The detail really stands out and several staff have requested shirts with this design to wear as every day praise.

Update on Chaplain Bob's Health

Bob & Linda have been active with “**Bill Glass Behind the Walls Ministry**” for the past 18 years. The last 3 years, Bob has been going in as one of the bikers with his 2005 Titan Sidewinder. In 2017 he did **SATF Corcoran Prison** on May 5, **Soledad Prison** on Sept. 23 and **CRC Prison** on Oct. 28, 2017. For 2018. Bob had to cancel Lancaster prison on March 10 and Santa Rita, CA area facilities on March 24 due to weather. Bob, Bonnie H. and George C, Did the Behind the Walls event at **High Desert State Prison** in Susanville, CA. on July 28, 2018. **C.I.M. prison in Corona, CA** is scheduled for Oct. 27th, 2018. Bob and staff will also be participating in the Fresno, Kings and Tulare, CA area event on May 4-5, 2018.

The Parkinson's has become slightly more noticeable and the doctors are surprised how slowly it has gained any ground. (Could it be that your inmate's prayers for Bob are being heard?) Bob can still predominately stop the shaking in the right hand (only affected area to date).

Bob had some lab tests run and some chest x-rays taken. The doctor explained that the common cause of the symptoms was congenital heart disease. The doctor scheduled Bob for Monday, August 28th for follow-up, The lab tests came back good – Praise The Lord. Bob was then referred to a cardiologist, where he had an EKG, PET Scan and ultrasound. Bob was scheduled for Sept 26th for follow-up results of these tests.

The results were no heart problems and in fact Bob had a very good heart.

I need to mention that Linda and I have received the BEST MEDICAL CARE I could ask for since we were able to get the military medical coverage since I was in the California Air National Guard for 21 years (Aircraft electrician) and California Army National Guard (Core of engineers and Military academy) for 2 years. Having worked in the medical field for over 20 years, I have seen good care and I have seen bad care. I have been in hospitals that I would not send my dog to. I have seen veterinary facilities that I would rather go to instead of some hospitals, currently we use the *Navel Air Station, Lemoore Hospital* as our primary provider. They are GREAT!!

A quick story of medical service. Bob had hernia surgery at NASL and took in a large cake for the Doctor and staff. The doctor asked Bob what it was for? Bob answered that is was for what the doctor did for him. He replied “*I only did what I was supposed to do.*” Bob said “*most doctors don't.*” At a later date Bob's wife, Linda, had a colonoscopy. Bob brought in another cake. The doctor asked what this cake was for. Bob replied that any man that was getting that close to his wife either deserved a drink or a cake. The doctor stated “*I wish I had more husbands with your attitude.*”

I pray in Christ, you're 'moving on'.



A LIFE BEING CHANGED BY JESUS CHRIST

If God was to write a story about any one of us, He would start by writing about our glorious end in the beginning. To God, our end is way more important than our beginning. In His eternal perspective, God loved us with an everlasting love which surpasses the limits of time. God loved us so much that He gave His only begotten Son to be sacrificed on the cross to pay the penalty of our sins and save us from death. Additionally, God does not see us as our old self. That is why when we believe in Jesus, He gives us a new life and we become a new creation. That is the beautiful love story that ends with an eternity spent with God.

My end will be your end too if you also choose to believe in Jesus Christ. My end will be an eternity of joy in the new heaven and new earth that God will create. There will no longer be a sun because God's Glory will light the entire Place. There will be no more pain, sorrow or tears: because there will be no more sin! My life will be an eternal worship of God in His Eternal Kingdom. This idea sounds like a dream but it is a reality because God promised it. God's promises are real, they do not change and they do not fail. God's promises have been revealed in the Bible and I believe them with all my heart. As we continue through this story, I ask you to keep this end at the forefront of your mind to seek to understand God's perspective in saving a wicked man like me.

In order to compare the old man that I used to be with the new man that God is changing me into. I will begin by telling you about my past life. I am a very private person and doing this is hard, painful and shameful. My friends call me Art and I was born in Mexico in 1988. I was raised mostly by my mother and grandmother in a low-income household. I was an only child and my mom's miracle after she struggled to conceive and even had a miscarriage before me. My parents raised me together until I was about 6 years old when my parents separated over my dad's alcoholism and physical abusiveness. After my parents separated, my dad was not active in my life and after my arrest he stopped all communication with me.

As a child we moved around in Mexico often as my mother pursued business opportunities that never worked out. As a result of that instability, I did not make many friends and I developed a level of resentment with my parents since I was a child. My resentment produced a level of distance in my relationship with my mother and I became secretive. As a child I experienced successes in school and in sports. I had a

promising life and I had huge dreams about becoming an engineer or an inventor. I cannot remember with certainty how old I was, but I went through a period of sexual abuse. At the time I did not understand what was happening, but the experience corrupted me sexually and I kept it secret from my parents.

At age 13 my mother, grandmother and I immigrated legally to the U.S. and we settled in Texas. We came with the intention to send me through high school and college. After college I would decide whether to stay, go back to Mexico or go to Europe with other relatives; but I ruined all those plans. After I came to the U.S., I started 8th grade in a mostly white school and I had a difficult time transitioning. I was fluent in English, but I felt rejected and even discriminated at times by students and teachers. I was not happy in that school and after I completed 8th grade, we moved to Houston and I began high school in a mostly Hispanic community. I felt more comfortable in this school and I began being very social. I also worked part-time after school in a furniture factory bagging mattresses. Through this job I quickly saved money to buy my first car when I was still 14. Being the only freshman in my school with a car, I became instantly popular with my peers. I was at the center of all the "fun" and I used to get in trouble sometimes. Despite my lifestyle, I was able to preserve a good reputation with teachers and with the parents of my friends, but in reality, I was skipping a lot of classes and I started using drugs and committing some petty crimes. By age 15, my uncle was getting me prostitutes and I started doing cocaine. I eventually started selling pirated CDs, DVDs, and porn as a hustle. I began developing a satisfaction from giving some of my peers their first experience of doing anything bad (like doing drugs, stealing, watching porn, picking up a prostitute, etc...) As I continued in my sinful lifestyle, I developed a criminal mind, while maintaining the "good kid" front. I even received an all straight A's award in the 11th grade and I was playing sports.

When I was in the 12th grade, I had a traumatic experience that impacted me and my attachment styles in relationships from then on. I was in a relationship with a girl my age who became my high school sweet heart for almost a year. We were the perfect couple and I wanted to marry her. I loved her and respected her boundaries and we never even had sex. It was a pure relationship and eventually our relationship was destroyed when she cheated on me and gave her virginity to another guy in our high school. All of our friends found out about it and it became a very public affair and

my heart was crushed. I was so hurt that I even dropped out of high school over my shame. I did not cope well with the experience and I lost my trust in women and I started drinking heavily. After that I became addicted to working, drinking, drugs, porn and sex.

Despite my dysfunctional lifestyle, I managed to finish high school two years later at an adult academy and I began taking college classes to pursue my childhood dream of becoming an engineer. I started a window cleaning company at 19 with a friend and it evolved into a construction company. I also worked part-time in a catering company since I was 16. I used to work very hard and I would blow all my money on my destructive habit. I wasted a good fortune over the years. As I continued to spiral down on my sexual corruption, I started hanging out with young teens. I began giving them money, drugs, alcohol and gifts; and I began sexually exploiting them. I continued with my illegal deviant sexual behavior until the FBI got a lead on me and began investigating me.

One quiet morning in January of 2011 while I was asleep with my 17 year-old "girlfriend", the FBI came knocking at my door and raided my apartment. There must have been over 10 heavily armed federal and local agents with SWAT gear that came for me. I remember that when I was heavily confronted by the agents with the reality and the consequences of my crimes. I felt a terrible amount of guilt, shame and remorse. What made it worse was that my mom was there that day. To be honest, my mom being there was the only reason why I did not try doing something stupid that day. I knew at that time that I was going to be put away for a long time. I felt terrible about betraying the trust, expectations and hope of so many people. I knew that my mother had all of her dreams, hopes, expectations and needs invested in me. I destroyed her life and future when I destroyed mine.

I was arrested that day and I arrived to a cold and nasty county jail. I was only 22 years old and that was my lowest point and that is exactly where Jesus found me and extended his grace to me. It was there and then when I humbled myself and cried out to God in repentance and He heard me and answered me with the most impactful message that I had ever heard. He told me: "I do not see you as who you have been or as what you have done. I see you as who you can be and what you can do in Christ. All is forgiven....." In that moment I was radically changed and became born again. I was amazed about how God would forgive me and save me just like that and with no strings attached. Then on top of that, to give me the unmerited gift of being called His son and giving me eternal life from that

moment on. That feeling has been described as the scandal of grace. It is incredible! After that day, I felt a huge level of gratitude about God's love for me. I gave my life to God and from then on, I no longer cared about what would happen to me. I told God: "My life is Yours. If you wish for me to spend the rest of my life in prison, then I will praise Your Name. If You wish for me to get out one day, then I will praise Your Name the same way. I just ask that You please take care of my mother and my grandmother. I am Yours". In my prayers God promised me that He would take care of my mother, my grandmother and me and that was all that I needed to hear to live a care free life. Eventually I was sentenced to 50 years and I was sent to a maximum-security federal prison in the desert of Tucson, AZ; but it does not matter because it is not my life but God's and he can spend it however He wants to as far as I am concerned.

After my arrest I began reading the Bible for the first time and even when I used to not like reading it at first, I eventually started loving it. I remember how when I was a spiritual baby in Christ, that God sent me many people to minister to me and help me grow. There even was another inmate that used to read me a chapter of the Bible a day and who got me on the habit of doing my daily Bible reading. I used to not understand how I would be able to change by reading the Bible. It used to not make sense to me, but then I found the story of Naaman in 2 Kings Chapter 5. How it did not make sense for Naaman to be cured from his leprosy by dipping himself seven times in the Jordan River as he was told by the prophet Elisha, but he did it by faith and he received the promised result. In the same way I took it to heart when I read the scriptures from Psalm 119:9- 11, 67-68: "How can a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed according to Your Word..... Your Word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against you.....Before I was afflicted I went astray, But now I keep Your Word. You are good, and do good; Teach me Your statutes."

After learning the principle of changing by the power of God's Word and experiencing it in my life, I am convinced that nobody can be transformed into the man or woman that God wants them to be without a daily habit of Bible reading. Only the Word of God has the power to change us into the child of God that we are intended to be. No Bible, no power source period.

Coming to prison was a humbling experience. I learned to live with much less and to get along with people from all walks of life. Prison is the great equalizer. In prison I was able to participate in some intense psychology programs to work on myself, my issues and to be a more rational thinker. I

have matured a lot and I have developed a new set of skills that God is using for the ministry. God has opened many doors for me and I have a call to dedicate my life to full-time ministry inside or outside of prison. I am currently working in the chapel of my prison and I am active in our church's ministries and I am loving it. By the Grace of God, I have not experienced many challenges while incarcerated and I have been safe and shot free. I am enjoying life one day at a time thanks to the joy of the Lord.

You explain that is all the time you can show with your 'Fresh Start,' The past is PAST. ***"Behold, Old things have passed away, all things have become new."***

When we are saved (born again) we have a Fresh Start and the past is PAST. When the devil tries to remind you of your past (gone), remind him of his future (firey pit)
