Calling on States to Make Prison Telephone Rates Affordable

Dear Friends,

Of all the factors that help inmates after their release, an intact family is the most important in helping them stay on the right path. Research shows that when returning inmates have a supportive family, they are more likely to find a job, less likely to use drugs and less likely to be involved in criminal activities. The support and accountability that a stable family provides have a clear, positive impact. For these reasons, you'd think that prisons would do all they can to strengthen relationships between inmates and their families. It seems reasonable that authorities would make strong family ties a top priority. Unfortunately, many don't. And that is bad for all of us: the prisoner, the family and the community.

Prisoners are often incarcerated hundreds of miles from their home, which makes visits with family members difficult, if not impossible. That's why prisoners rely on telephone calls to keep in touch with loved ones. Some prisons, however, are adding exorbitant charges to prison phone calls, claiming that the more expensive services are necessary to ensure that criminal activities—such as making threats or doing drug deals—are not perpetrated. The prison authorities fail to mention, however, that the prisons, and sometimes even the states, are profiting from these calls. Recent estimates show that prison phone services nationwide generate as much as \$1 billion a year.

Prisoners can't receive calls, they can only make collect calls. Some states charge as much as \$3.95 to place the call, plus an additional 89 cents per minute. For instance, New York once used inmate phones as a profit center. MCI, which provided the phone service, paid the prison system 57.5 percent of the fees it charged for prisoners' collect calls. The state then allowed MCI to charge outrageously

high rates: 16 cents or more a minute, plus a \$3 surcharge for every call. But don't think it was the inmates paying for this outrage. It was their families who had to pick up the tab—as much as \$300 to \$400 a month. In 2007, the New York Legislature made it illegal for the Department of Correctional Services to accept revenue in excess of its reasonable costs for operating an inmate phone system. New York no longer receives a percentage and prison phone rates have dropped to 15 cents per minute. Our communities have a huge stake in the successful reentry of inmates after they serve their sentences. Over 700,000 inmates will be released from prison this year. These returning inmates will be our neighbors. Will they have the stability and support of an intact family? Or will they be cast adrift with no social network other than their old friends that got them in trouble in the first place? A supportive family often makes the difference between inmates becoming healthy, contributing members of society or returning to criminal behavior. You can help by contacting your legislators and asking them to review your state's policies regarding prison phone rates. If this policy undercuts inmate families, ask them to work with you to change it.

I urge you also to write to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) about their [Inmate Telephone Service](#). Prison Fellowship and our allies in this effort will be meeting soon with FCC staff on a proposal that was filed in 2007 requesting that the FCC establish rate caps for interstate long-distance inmate payphone services. Am I Really Saved?

“The Spirit of God bears witness with our spirit that we are the children of God.” Romans 8:16

I’m kind of fired up because without a doubt, I have the most important subject in the universe to talk to you about today. If you have “it,” you have everything that you need. But without it, you don’t have anything—no matter how much you have. Many people think they have this but they don’t, and sadly many people who *do* have it, take it for granted. Recognized in all of its splendor you would die for it, but ironically unless you have it, you will die.

What is it that I’m talking about? It is the story of Scripture. It is the miracle of the age. It is the reason that Jesus came, died, and rose again. Sinners call it *conversion*; theologians call it *justification*. Children call it, *asking Jesus into their hearts*, and Jesus called it, *being born again*. Most frequently the Bible calls it *salvation*.

Rightly understood, salvation is the crown jewel of Christianity and the constant comfort of the Lord’s people. But it can also cause much confusion. In fact, surprisingly even in churches that preach the biblical message of salvation, a lot of people are confused about exactly what salvation is and how it works.

This week on the broadcast, I’ll clear up three crucial issues about salvation:

1. How is a person saved? How does it happen?
2. How do you know if you’ve been saved?
3. Can you lose your salvation?

Right now, we’ll focus on the second issue, *how can you be absolutely sure that you’ve been saved?*

If you’re saved, you belong to God. God has made a mark on you. He has sealed you. What is that assurance that you belong to Him? Look at Ephesians 1:13: **“Having believed you were sealed with the Holy Spirit.”** So here it is—if you’ve been saved, you have the Holy Spirit. If you’re not saved, you don’t have the Holy Spirit. So the question then is, *how do I know if I have the Holy Spirit?*

We’re gonna get this settled right now. Are you saved? **If you’re saved, the Holy Spirit is doing these six things in your life.**

There’s many more things we could have included on this list but I chose what I thought were the six main ones.

1. The Holy Spirit is growing you.

(Galatians 5:22) If you’re saved, you’re more godly than you used to be. You’re changing. You might have symptoms of your old problems but you don’t give into them like you used to. You’re being set free from addictions. Your character is growing. When you are saved, the Spirit is developing in you “... love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, self-control”—fruit of His character.

I'll use myself as an example here. I've got problems; I'm not perfect. But the people who know me best, my family, my close friends, the people that I work with, all would say in unison, "James is not who he was five years ago. God's growing and changing him." Is God growing and changing you? That's a work of His Spirit.

2. The Holy Spirit has gifted you. (1 Corinthians 12) When the Spirit of God comes into your life He gives you the desire and the ability to serve God. If you're saved, He has gifted you with a specific way you can serve the body of Christ. You are prompted to get beyond selfish consumer Christianity and into the center of what He is doing to build His kingdom.

3. The Holy Spirit convicts you of sin. (John 16:8) You're like, "It's the craziest thing, man. Before I knew Christ I could lie, and steal, and be mean to my sister-in-law, but never even felt bad about it. Since I got saved, every time I do anything wrong this siren goes off inside me." That's the Spirit at work, convicting you of sin. If you can sin and not be grieved, ask yourself if you're really saved.

4. Hunger for truth. (John 16:13) Was there a time when you couldn't have cared less about the Bible? If somebody said to you, 'Are you reading the Bible?' you would have been, 'No, I'm reading Louie L'Amour right now.' But when you got saved, your desire to learn this book exploded in your heart. If that's going on in your life, that's a very good sign.

5. The Holy Spirit leads you.

(Romans 8:14) What does *that* mean? God's Spirit prompts you to make things right with others, to respond to the message that you hear at church, to want to do the thing that honors Him. When you're being led by the Spirit, you know there's something going on in your heart. **"As many as are led by the Spirit of God these are the children of God."**

6. The Holy Spirit comforts you. (John 14:16) Has there ever been a time in your life when you struggled with just about everything? But since you came to know Christ, things don't bother you as much. The Spirit supplies strength that you didn't have before and you're now able to get through things that you couldn't before. God Himself bears you along and helps you get through the tough stuff. That's one of the things the Spirit of God does—He comforts us.

God wants you to know that you're His child, and if you're wondering about it, read Romans 8:16, **"the Spirit of God bears witness with our spirit that we are the children of God."** If you're wondering, "*God, am I your child?*" do this: get alone, read the Scriptures that I've mentioned above and pray, "God, do I really know you?" The Spirit Himself will either bear witness, "Yes" or "No." You don't have to wonder anymore.

Get this settled right now. If you have more questions, listen to this complete message online. No one should be confused about this issue. *Know* that you *know* that you *know*. It's that important.

Avoid Being Lost

With this day of modern technology, we often overlook the obvious because we have something to take care of, or solve the problem for us. Take for example the age old statement that “*men never stop to ask for directions.*” Now we find the availability of **Global Position System** that will locate where we are and by programming our destination address or description, the device will plot out the shortest, fastest way to get there.

For us to decide to use the GPS, we must first have the desire of knowing where we are at. Next, we must have a desire of getting to a determined destination. And finally, we must have a desire to go the most direct route.

Let’s look at the principle that the GPS works on. There is a signal sent from outer space that is locked on. With two of these signals we can get an approximation of where we are at. With a 3rd satellite signal we can get exact location including elevation. This is thru a principle called triangulation (‘tri’ meaning 3). *To get all the information requires the 3 signals to lock in on.*

The path of life is much as the path of travel. Often there are rough roads. Often we take a wrong turn. Sometimes we travel thru life at high speed trying to make up for lost time. Sometimes there are obstacles in the path. Sometimes there are detours

posted. But one principle is still the same, *to get all the information requires the 3 signals to lock in on.* A child raised with only a mother, or father, gets only one of those 2 ‘signals.’ A child raised without the principles of God, is missing the most important signal. For life to be meaningful, filled with joy, and complete, we MUST have (and lock in on) the signal (His Word) that God sends us. Although a GPS may have all the potential, without the proper signals, it remains lost. A child without both parents and the triune Godhead is in the fight to find proper direction.

Yes, when we are really lost in life, we can turn to the GPS for location and directions. When we want to stay on the right road in life, we can turn to the GPS. When we realize GPS stands for “**God’s Perfect Son**”, we will know that we have applied the right principals to life. We will understand that we must put total trust in the ‘guidance system’ and that it will not fail us. We also need to accept “all three” to keep on the right path – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Many individuals do not let the Holy Spirit have control and thus miss out on one of the signals. Others deny that Jesus was God come in the flesh and loose that part of the triangulation. The **GPS** is fully capable, but you have to turn it on and lock into the signals from Heaven.
